Lesson 2: Jesus, The Word of God

John 1:1-9

- ¹In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
- ²He was in the beginning with God.
- ³ All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be.

What came to be ⁴through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race;

- ⁵ the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.
- ⁶ A man named John was sent from God. ⁷ He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. ⁸ He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. ⁹ The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

Isaiah 42:16

¹⁶I will lead the blind on a way they do not know; by paths they do not know I will guide them. I will turn darkness into light before them, and make crooked ways straight. These are my promises: I made them, I will not forsake them.

John 1:10-18

- 10 He was in the world, and the world came to be through him, but the world did not know him.
 11 He came to what was his own, but his own people did not accept him.
- ¹² But to those who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to those who believe in his name, ¹³ who were born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God.
- ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth.
- ¹⁵ John testified to him and cried out, saying, "This was he of whom I said, 'The one who is coming after me ranks ahead of me because he existed before me." ¹⁶ From his fullness we have all received, grace in place of grace, ¹⁷ because while the law was given through Moses, grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸ No one has ever seen God. The only Son, God, who is at the Father's side, has revealed him.

Philippians 2:5-8

⁵ Have among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ Who, though he was in the form

of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. ⁷ Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, ⁸ he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross.

Wisdom 18:14-15

¹⁴ For when peaceful stillness encompassed everything and the night in its swift course was half spent, ¹⁵ Your all-powerful word from heaven's royal throne leapt into the doomed land,

John 1:19-34

¹⁹ And this is the testimony of John. When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites [to him] to ask him, "Who are you?" 20 he admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Messiah." ²¹ So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." 22 So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" 23 He said: "I am 'the voice of one crying out in the desert, "Make straight the way of the Lord," as Isaiah the prophet said." ²⁴ Some Pharisees were also sent. ²⁵ They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Messiah or Elijah or the Prophet?" ²⁶ John answered them, "I baptize with water, but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, ²⁷ the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." ²⁸ This happened in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

²⁹ The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. ³⁰ He is the one of whom I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.' ³¹ I did not know him, but the reason why I came baptizing with water was that he might be made known to Israel." ³² John testified further, saying, "I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from the sky and remain upon him. ³³ I did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the holy Spirit.' ³⁴ Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God."

Exodus 12:21-27

²¹ Moses summoned all the elders of Israel and said to them, "Go and procure lambs for your families, and slaughter the Passover victims. ²² Then take a bunch of

hyssop, and dipping it in the blood that is in the basin, apply some of this blood to the lintel and the two doorposts. And none of you shall go outdoors until morning. ²³ For when the LORD goes by to strike down the Egyptians, seeing the blood on the lintel and the two doorposts, the LORD will pass over that door and not let the destroyer come into your houses to strike you down.

²⁴ "You will keep this practice forever as a statute for yourselves and your descendants. ²⁵ Thus, when you have entered the land which the LORD will give you as he promised, you must observe this rite. ²⁶ When your children ask you, 'What does this rite of yours mean?' ²⁷ you will reply, 'It is the Passover sacrifice for the LORD, who passed over the houses of the Israelites in Egypt; when he struck down the Egyptians, he delivered our houses.'"

Isaiah 53:6-11

⁶We had all gone astray like sheep, all following our own way; But the LORD laid upon him the guilt of us all. ⁷Though harshly treated, he submitted and did not open his mouth; Like a lamb led to slaughter or a sheep silent before shearers, he did not open his mouth. 8 Seized and condemned, he was taken away. Who would have thought any more of his destiny? For he was cut off from the land of the living, struck for the sins of his people. ⁹ He was given a grave among the wicked, a burial place with evildoers, Though he had done no wrong, nor was deceit found in his mouth. 10 But it was the LORD's will to crush him with pain. By making his life as a reparation offering, he shall see his offspring, shall lengthen his days, and the LORD's will shall be accomplished through him. ¹¹ Because of his anguish he shall see the light; because of his knowledge he shall be content; My servant, the just one, shall justify the many, their iniquity he shall bear.

But if we walk in the light as he is in the light, then we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of his Son Jesus cleanses us from all sin.

John 1:35-42

³⁵ The next day John was there again with two of his disciples, 36 and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." ³⁷ The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. 38 Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" ³⁹ He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. 40 Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. ⁴¹ He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). 42 Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John you will be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

Matthew 16:18

And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it.

John 1:43-51

⁴³ The next day he decided to go to Galilee, and he found Philip. And Jesus said to him, "Follow me." 44 Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the town of Andrew and Peter. 45 Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one about whom Moses wrote in the law, and also the prophets, Jesus son of Joseph, from Nazareth." 46 But Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come from Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." 47 Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him and said of him, "Here is a true Israelite. There is no duplicity in him." 48 Nathanael said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered and said to him, "Before Philip called you, I saw you under the fig tree." 49 Nathanael answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the King of Israel." ⁵⁰ Jesus answered and said to him, "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than this." 51 And he said to him, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you will see the sky opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."

Genesis 28:11-19

¹¹ When he came upon a certain place, he stopped there for the night, since the sun had already set. Taking one

of the stones at the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place. ¹² Then he had a dream: a stairway rested on the ground, with its top reaching to the heavens; and God's angels were going up and down on it. ¹³ And there was the LORD standing beside him and saying: I am the LORD, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you are lying I will give to you and your descendants. ¹⁴ Your descendants will be like the dust of the earth, and through them you will spread to the west and the east, to the north and the south. In you and your descendants all the families of the earth will find blessing. ¹⁵ I am with you and will protect you wherever you go, and bring you back to this land. I will never leave you until I have done what I promised you.

¹⁶ When Jacob awoke from his sleep, he said, "Truly, the LORD is in this place and I did not know it!" ¹⁷ He was afraid and said: "How awesome this place is! This is nothing else but the house of God, the gateway to heaven!" ¹⁸ Early the next morning Jacob took the stone that he had put under his head, set it up as a sacred

pillar, and poured oil on top of it. ¹⁹ He named that place Bethel, whereas the former name of the town had been Luz.

John 10:7-9

⁷ So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. ⁸ All who came [before me] are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. ⁹ I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture.

John 2:19-22

¹⁹ Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." ²⁰ The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, ^[D] and you will raise it up in three days?" ²¹ But he was speaking about the temple of his body. ²² Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

Verse Study: John 1:14

¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth.

Lesson 3: Jesus, Our Source of Fulfillment

John 2:1-12

¹On the third day there was a wedding in Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. ² Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. ³ When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." 4 [And] Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." ⁵ His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." 6 Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. ⁷ Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. 8 Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. ⁹ And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from (although the servers who had drawn the water knew), the headwaiter called the bridegroom ¹⁰ and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." 11 Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs in Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him. ¹²After this, he and his mother, [his] brothers, and his disciples went down to Capernaum and stayed there only a few days.

John 11:45-53

⁴⁵ Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him. ⁴⁶ But some of them went to the Pharisees and told them what Jesus had done. ⁴⁷ So the chief priests and the Pharisees convened the Sanhedrin and said, "What are we going to do? This man is performing many signs. ⁴⁸ If we leave him alone, all will believe in him, and the Romans will come and take away both our land and our nation." ⁴⁹ But one of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing, ⁵⁰ nor do you consider that it is better for you that one man should die instead of the people, so that the whole nation may not perish." ⁵¹ He did not say this on his own, but since he was high priest for that year, he prophesied

that Jesus was going to die for the nation, ⁵² and not only for the nation, but also to gather into one the dispersed children of God. ⁵³ So from that day on they planned to kill him.

John 12:23-24

²³ Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit.

John 2:13-25

¹³Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ¹⁴ He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the moneychangers seated there. ¹⁵ He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the moneychangers and overturned their tables, ¹⁶ and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." ¹⁷His disciples recalled the words of scripture, "Zeal for your house will consume me." 18 At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" 19 Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." ²⁰ The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for fortysix years, and you will raise it up in three days?" 21 But he was speaking about the temple of his body. ²² Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

²³ While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. ²⁴ But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, ²⁵ and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

Numbers 28:16-25

¹⁶ The fourteenth day of the first month is the Passover of the LORD, ¹⁷ and the fifteenth day of this month is the pilgrimage feast. For seven days unleavened bread is to be eaten. ¹⁸ On the first day you will declare a holy day, and you shall do no heavy work. ¹⁹ You will offer an oblation, a burnt offering to the LORD: two bulls of the herd, one ram, and seven yearling lambs that you are sure are unblemished. ²⁰ Their grain offerings will be of

bran flour mixed with oil; you will offer three tenths of an ephah for each bull and two tenths for the ram. ²¹ You will offer one tenth for each of the seven lambs; ²² and one goat as a purification offering to make atonement for yourselves. ²³ These offerings you will make in addition to the morning burnt offering which is part of the regular burnt offering. ²⁴ You will make exactly the same offerings each day for seven days as food offerings, oblations of pleasing aroma to the LORD; they will be offered in addition to the regular burnt offering with its libation. ²⁵ On the seventh day you will declare a holy day: you shall do no heavy work.

1 Peter 2:23

When he was insulted, he returned no insult; when he suffered, he did not threaten; instead, he handed himself over to the one who judges justly.

John 3:1-15

¹ Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. ² He came to Jesus at night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God, for no one can do these signs that you are doing unless God is with him." 3 Jesus answered and said to him, "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." ⁴ Nicodemus said to him, "How can a person once grown old be born again? Surely he cannot reenter his mother's womb and be born again, can he?" ⁵ Jesus answered, "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶ What is born of flesh is flesh and what is born of spirit is spirit. ⁷ Do not be amazed that I told you, 'You must be born from above.' 8 The wind blows where it wills, and you can hear the sound it makes, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes; so it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." 9 Nicodemus answered and said to him, "How can this happen?" 10 Jesus answered and said to him, "You are the teacher of Israel and you do not understand this? ¹¹ Amen, amen, I say to you, we speak of what we know and we testify to what we have seen, but you people do not accept our testimony. ¹² If I tell you about earthly things and you do not believe, how will you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? 13 No one has gone up to heaven except the one who has come down from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴ And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be

lifted up, ¹⁵ so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life."

Titus 3:5

⁵ not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the holy Spirit,

1 Peter 3:21

This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Ezekiel 36:25-27

²⁵I will sprinkle clean water over you to make you clean; from all your impurities and from all your idols I will cleanse you. ²⁶I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. ²⁷I will put my spirit within you so that you walk in my statutes, observe my ordinances, and keep them.

Isaiah 44:3

³ I will pour out water upon the thirsty ground, streams upon the dry land; I will pour out my spirit upon your offspring, my blessing upon your descendants.

- ⁴ From Mount Hor they set out by way of the Red Sea, to bypass the land of Edom, but the people's patience was worn out by the journey; ⁵ so the people complained against God and Moses, "Why have you brought us up from Egypt to die in the wilderness, where there is no food or water? We are disgusted with this wretched food!"
- ⁶ So the LORD sent among the people seraph serpents, which bit the people so that many of the Israelites died. ⁷ Then the people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned in complaining against the LORD and you. Pray to the LORD to take the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people, ⁸ and the LORD said to Moses: Make a seraph and mount it on a pole, and everyone who has been bitten will look at it and recover. ⁹ Accordingly Moses made a bronze serpent and mounted it on a pole, and whenever the serpent bit someone, the person looked at the bronze serpent and recovered.

John 3:16-21

¹⁶ For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. ¹⁸ Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. ¹⁹And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. ²⁰ For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. ²¹ But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

2 Peter 3:9

⁹ The Lord does not delay his promise, as some regard "delay," but he is patient with you, not wishing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance.

John 3:22-36

²²After this, Jesus and his disciples went into the region of Judea, where he spent some time with them baptizing. ²³ John was also baptizing in Aenon near Salim, because there was an abundance of water there, and people came to be baptized, ²⁴ for John had not yet been imprisoned. ²⁵ Now a dispute arose between the disciples of John and a Jew about ceremonial washings. ²⁶ So they came to John and said to him, "Rabbi, the one who was with you across the Jordan, to whom you testified, here he is baptizing and everyone is coming to him." ²⁷ John answered and said, "No one can receive anything except what has been given him from heaven. 28 You yourselves can testify that I said [that] I am not the Messiah, but that I was sent before him. ²⁹ The one who has the bride is the bridegroom; the best man, who stands and listens to him, rejoices greatly at the bridegroom's voice. So this joy of mine has been made complete. 30 He must increase; I must decrease."

³¹ The one who comes from above is above all. The one who is of the earth is earthly and speaks of earthly things. But the one who comes from heaven [is above all]. ³² He testifies to what he has seen and heard, but no one accepts his testimony. ³³ Whoever does accept his testimony certifies that God is trustworthy. ³⁴ For the one whom God sent speaks the words of God. He does not ration his gift of the Spirit. ³⁵ The Father loves the Son and has given everything over to him. ³⁶ Whoever

believes in the Son has eternal life, but whoever disobeys the Son will not see life, but the wrath of God remains upon him.

1 Corinthians 12:4-11

4 There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; 5 there are different forms of service but the same Lord; 6 there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. 7 To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. 8 To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; 9 to another faith by the same Spirit; to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit; 10 to another mighty deeds; to another prophecy; to another discernment of spirits; to another

varieties of tongues; to another interpretation of tongues. 11 But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.

Lesson 4: Jesus, The Living Water

2 Kings 17:33

³³ They were both venerating the Lord and serving their own gods. They followed the custom of the nations from among whom they had been deported.

John 4:1-8

¹Now when Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard that Jesus was making and baptizing more disciples than John ² (although Jesus himself was not baptizing, just his disciples), ³ he left Judea and returned to Galilee.

⁴ He had to pass through Samaria. ⁵ So he came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon.

John 4:7-15

⁷ A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." ⁸ His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. ⁹ The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" (For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans.) ¹⁰ Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me

a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." ¹¹ [The woman] said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the well is deep; where then can you get this living water? ¹² Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this well and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?" ¹³ Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; ¹⁴ but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." ¹⁵ The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water."

Jeremiah 2:13

¹³ Two evils my people have done: they have forsaken me, the source of living waters; They have dug themselves cisterns, broken cisterns that cannot hold water.

John 4:16-26

¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Go call your husband and come back." ¹⁷ The woman answered and said to him, "I do not have a husband." Jesus answered her, "You are right in saying, 'I do not have a husband.' ¹⁸ For you have had

five husbands, and the one you have now is not your husband. What you have said is true." 19 The woman said to him, "Sir, I can see that you are a prophet. 20 Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem." ²¹ Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. ²² You people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews. ²³ But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him. ²⁴ God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth." ²⁵ The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Anointed; when he comes, he will tell us everything." ²⁶ Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one who is speaking with you."

1 John 1:8-9

⁸ If we say, "We are without sin," we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁹ If we acknowledge our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from every wrongdoing.

Ephesians 3:17-19

¹⁷ and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸ may have strength to comprehend with all the holy ones what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

2 Corinthians 5:17-19

¹⁷So whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come. ¹⁸ And all this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation, ¹⁹ namely, God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.

Matthew 16:16

¹⁶ Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God

Mark 14:61-62

⁶¹ But he was silent and answered nothing. Again the high priest asked him and said to him, "Are you the

Messiah, the son of the Blessed One?" ⁶² Then Jesus answered, "I am; and 'you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of the Power and coming with the clouds of heaven."

John 4:27-42

Could he possibly be the Messiah?" ³⁰ They went out of the town and came to him. ³¹ Meanwhile, the disciples urged him, "Rabbi, eat." 32 But he said to them, "I have food to eat of which you do not know." ³³ So the disciples said to one another, "Could someone have brought him something to eat?" 34 Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of the one who sent me and to finish his work. 35 Do you not say, 'In four months the harvest will be here'? I tell you, look up and see the fields ripe for the harvest. ³⁶ The reaper is already receiving his payment and gathering crops for eternal life, so that the sower and reaper can rejoice together. ³⁷ For here the saying is verified that 'One sows and another reaps.' 38 I sent you to reap what you have not worked for; others have done the work, and you are sharing the fruits of their work."

³⁹ Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him because of the word of the woman who testified, "He told me everything I have done." ⁴⁰ When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. ⁴¹ Many more began to believe in him because of his word, ⁴² and they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."

² He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest.

live." The man believed what Jesus said to him and left. ⁵¹ While he was on his way back, his slaves met him and told him that his boy would live. ⁵² He asked them when he began to recover. They told him, "The fever left him yesterday, about one in the afternoon." ⁵³ The father realized that just at that time Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live," and he and his whole household came to believe. ⁵⁴ [Now] this was the second sign Jesus did when he came to Galilee from Judea.

Lesson 7: Jesus, The Eucharist

John 6:1-15

¹ After this, Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee [of Tiberias]. ² A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick. ³ Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. ⁴ The Jewish feast of Passover was near. ⁵ When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" ⁶He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. ⁷ Philip answered him, "Two hundred days" wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little [bit]." 8 One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, ⁹ "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" 10 Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. 11 Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. 12 When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the

fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." ¹³ So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. ¹⁴ When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." ¹⁵ Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.

What can you do? 31 Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written:

'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'"

³² So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. ³³ For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

³⁴ So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." ³⁵Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever

believes in me will never thirst. ³⁶ But I told you that although you have seen [me], you do not believe. ³⁷ Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and I will not reject anyone who comes to me, ³⁸ because I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me. ³⁹ And this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me, but that I should raise it [on] the last day. ⁴⁰ For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him [on] the last day."

⁴¹The Jews murmured about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven," ⁴² and they said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother? Then how can he say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" ⁴³ Jesus answered and said to them, "Stop murmuring^[] among yourselves. ⁴⁴ No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draw him, and I will raise him on the last day. ⁴⁵ It is written in the prophets:

'They shall all be taught by God.'

Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from him comes to me. ⁴⁶ Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. ⁴⁷ Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. ⁴⁸ I am the bread of life. ⁴⁹ Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; ⁵⁰ this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. ⁵¹ I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever." ⁵⁹ These things he said while teaching in the synagogue in Capernaum.

The words I have spoken to you are spirit and life. for sold it is the segment of you who do not believe." Jesus knew from the beginning the ones who would not believe and the one who would betray him. for this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father."

⁶⁶ As a result of this, many [of] his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. ⁶⁷ Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" ⁶⁸ Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. ⁶⁹ We have come to believe and are convinced that

you are the Holy One of God." ⁷⁰ Jesus answered them, "Did I not choose you twelve? Yet is not one of you a devil?" ⁷¹ He was referring to Judas, son of Simon the

Iscariot; it was he who would betray him, one of the Twelve.

Lesson 8: Jesus, Our Model of Fidelity

John 7:1-9

¹After this, Jesus moved about within Galilee; but he did not wish to travel in Judea, because the Jews were trying to kill him. ² But the Jewish feast of Tabernacles was near. ³ So his brothers said to him, "Leave here and go to Judea, so that your disciples also may see the works you are doing. ⁴ No one works in secret if he wants to be known publicly. If you do these things, manifest yourself to the world." ⁵ For his brothers did not believe in him. ⁶ So Jesus said to them, "My time is not yet here, but the time is always right for you. ⁵ The world cannot hate you, but it hates me, because I testify to it that its works are evil. 8 You go up to the feast. I am not going up to this feast, because my time has not yet been fulfilled." ९ After he had said this, he stayed on in Galilee.

Leviticus 23:33-43

³³ The LORD said to Moses: ³⁴ Tell the Israelites: The fifteenth day of this seventh month is the LORD's feast of Booths, which shall continue for seven days. ³⁵ On the first day, a declared holy day, you shall do no heavy work. ³⁶ For seven days you shall offer an oblation to the LORD, and on the eighth day you will have a declared holy day. You shall offer an oblation to the LORD. It is the festival closing. You shall do no heavy work.

³⁷These, therefore, are the festivals of the LORD which you shall declare holy days, in order to offer as an oblation to the LORD burnt offerings and grain offerings, sacrifices and libations, as prescribed for each day, ³⁸ in addition to the LORD's sabbaths, your donations, your various votive offerings, and the voluntary offerings that you present to the LORD.

³⁹ On the fifteenth day, then, of the seventh month, when you have gathered in the produce of the land, you shall celebrate the feast of the LORD for a whole week. The first and the eighth day shall be days of rest. ⁴⁰ On the first day you shall gather fruit of majestic trees, branches of palms, and boughs of leafy trees and valley willows.

Then for a week you shall make merry before the LORD, your God. ⁴¹ You shall keep this feast of the LORD for one whole week in the year. By perpetual statute throughout your generations in the seventh month of the year, you shall keep it. ⁴² You shall dwell in booths for seven days; every native-born Israelite shall dwell in booths, ⁴³ that your descendants may realize that, when I led the Israelites out of the land of Egypt, I made them dwell in booths. I, the LORD, am your God.

Deuteronomy 16:13-16

¹³ You shall celebrate the feast of Booths for seven days, when you have gathered in the produce from your threshing floor and wine press. ¹⁴ You shall rejoice at your feast, together with your son and daughter, your male and female slave, and also the Levite, the resident alien, the orphan and the widow within your gates. ¹⁵ For seven days you shall celebrate this feast for the LORD, your God, in the place which the LORD will choose; since the LORD, your God, has blessed you in all your crops and in all your undertakings, you will be full of joy. ¹⁶ Three times a year, then, all your males shall appear before the LORD, your God, in the place which he will choose: at the feast of Unleavened Bread, at the feast of Weeks, and at the feast of Booths. They shall not appear before the LORD empty-handed,

Numbers 20:2-11

² Since the community had no water, they held an assembly against Moses and Aaron. ³ The people quarreled with Moses, exclaiming, "Would that we had perished when our kindred perished before the LORD! ⁴ Why have you brought the LORD's assembly into this wilderness for us and our livestock to die here? ⁵ Why have you brought us up out of Egypt, only to bring us to this wretched place? It is not a place for grain nor figs nor vines nor pomegranates! And there is no water to drink!" ⁶ But Moses and Aaron went away

from the assembly to the entrance of the tent of meeting, where they fell prostrate.

Then the glory of the LORD appeared to them, ⁷ and the LORD said to Moses: ⁸ Take the staff and assemble the community, you and Aaron your brother, and in their presence command the rock to yield its waters. ¹⁰ But when his brothers had gone up to the feast, he himself also went up, not openly but [as it were] in secret. ¹¹ The Jews were looking for him at the feast and saying, "Where is he?" ¹² And there was considerable murmuring about him in the crowds. Some said, "He is a good man," [while] others said, "No; on the contrary, he misleads the crowd." ¹³ Still, no one spoke openly about him because they were afraid of the Jews.

¹⁴ When the feast was already half over, Jesus went up into the temple area and began to teach. ¹⁵The Jews were amazed and said, "How does he know scripture without having studied?" ¹⁶ Jesus answered them and said, "My teaching is not my own but is from the one who sent me. ¹⁷ Whoever chooses to do his will shall know whether my teaching is from God or whether I speak on my own. ¹⁸ Whoever speaks on his own seeks his own glory, but whoever seeks the glory of the one who sent him is truthful, and there is no wrong in him. ¹⁹ Did not Moses give you the law? Yet none of you

keeps the law. Why are you trying to kill me?" ²⁰ The crowd answered, "You are possessed! [h] Who is trying to kill you?" ²¹ Jesus answered and said to them, "I performed one work and all of you are amazed ²² because of it. Moses gave you circumcision—not that it came from Moses but rather from the patriarchs—and you circumcise a man on the sabbath. ²³ If a man can receive circumcision on a sabbath so that the law of Moses may not be broken, are you angry with me because I made a whole person well on a sabbath? ²⁴ Stop judging by appearances, but judge justly."

John 5:1-9

¹ After this, there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ² Now there is in Jerusalem at the Sheep [Gate] a pool called in Hebrew Bethesda, with five porticoes. ³ In these lay a large number of ill, blind, lame, and crippled. [⁴] ⁵ One man was there who had been ill for thirty-eight years. ⁶ When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had been ill for a long time, he said to him, "Do you want to be well?" ⁷ The sick man answered him, "Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; while I am on my way, someone else gets down there before me." ⁸ Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your mat, and walk." ⁹ Immediately the man became well, took up his mat, and walked.

John 7:25-36

²⁵ So some of the inhabitants of Jerusalem said, "Is he not the one they are trying to kill? ²⁶ And look, he is speaking openly and they say nothing to him. Could the authorities^[]] have realized that he is the Messiah? ²⁷ But we know where he is from. When the Messiah comes, no one will know where he is from." ²⁸ So Jesus cried out in the temple area as he was teaching and said, "You know me and also know where I am from. Yet I did not come on my own, but the one who sent me, whom you do not know, is true. ²⁹ I know him, because I am from him, and he sent me." ³⁰ So they tried to arrest him, but no one laid a hand upon him, because his hour had not yet come. ³¹ But many of the crowd began to believe in him, and said, "When the Messiah comes, will he perform more signs than this man has done?"

³² The Pharisees heard the crowd murmuring about him to this effect, and the chief priests and the Pharisees sent guards to arrest him. ³³ So Jesus said, "I will be with you only a little while longer, and then I will go to the one who sent me. ³⁴ You will look for me but not find [me], and where I am you cannot come." ³⁵ So the Jews said to one another, "Where is he going that we will not find

him? Surely he is not going to the dispersion^[] among the Greeks to teach the Greeks, is he? ³⁶ What is the meaning of his saying, 'You will look for me and not find [me], and where I am you cannot come'?"

John 7:37-39

³⁷On the last and greatest day of the feast, Jesus stood up and exclaimed, "Let anyone who thirsts come to me and drink. ³⁸ Whoever believes in me, as scripture says: 'Rivers of living water will flow from within him.'"

³⁹ He said this in reference to the Spirit that those who came to believe in him were to receive. There was, of course, no Spirit yet, because Jesus had not yet been glorified.

So what do you say?" ⁶ They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. ⁷ But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." 8 Again he bent down and wrote on the ground. ⁹ And in response, they went away one by one, beginning with the elders. ⁴⁸ The Jews answered and said to him, "Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and are possessed?" 49 Jesus answered, "I am not possessed; I honor my Father, but you dishonor me. ⁵⁰I do not seek my own glory; there is one who seeks it and he is the one who judges. ⁵¹ Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever keeps my word will never see death." 52 [So] the Jews said to him, "Now we are sure that you are possessed. Abraham died, as did the prophets, yet you say, 'Whoever keeps my word will never taste death.' 53 Are you greater than our father Abraham, ^[M] who died? Or the prophets, who died? Who do you make yourself out to be?" ⁵⁴ Jesus answered, "If I glorify myself, my glory is worth nothing; but it is my Father who glorifies me, of whom you say, 'He is our God.' 55 You do not know him, but I know him. And if I should say that I do not know him, I would be like you a liar. But I do know him and I keep his word. 56 Abraham your father rejoiced to see my day; he saw it and was glad. ⁵⁷ So the Jews said to him, "You are not yet fifty years old and you have seen Abraham?" 58 Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, before Abraham came to be, I AM." 59 So they picked up stones to throw at him; but Jesus hid and went out of the temple area.

Lesson 11: Jesus, the Consoler and Shepherd

John 9:1-12

¹As he passed by he saw a man blind from birth. ²His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his

parents, that he was born blind?" ³ Jesus answered, "Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him. ⁴We have to do the works of the one who sent me while it is day.

Night is coming when no one can work. ⁵ While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." ⁶ When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, ⁷ and said to him, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam" (which means Sent). So he went and washed, and came back able to see.

⁸ His neighbors and those who had seen him earlier as a beggar said, "Isn't this the one who used to sit and beg?" ⁹ Some said, "It is," but others said, "No, he just looks like him." He said, "I am." ¹⁰ So they said to him, "[So] how were your eyes opened?" ¹¹ He replied, "The man called Jesus made clay and anointed my eyes and told me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' So I went there and washed and was able to see." ¹² And they said to him, "Where is he?" He said, "I don't know."

Job 31:3

³ Is it not calamity for the unrighteous, and woe for evildoers?

Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. ¹¹ Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. ¹² When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." ¹³ So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat.

Mark 14:22-25

He said to them, "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see." ¹⁶ So some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath." [But] others said, "How can a sinful man do such signs?" And there was a division among them. ¹⁷ So they said to the blind man again, "What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet."

¹⁸ Now the Jews did not believe that he had been blind and gained his sight until they summoned the parents of the one who had gained his sight. ¹⁹ They asked them, "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How does he now see?" ²⁰ His parents answered and said, "We know that this is our son and that he was born blind. ²¹ We do not know how he sees now, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him, he is of age; he can speak for himself." ²² His parents said this because they were afraid

of the Jews, for the Jews had already agreed that if anyone acknowledged him as the Messiah, he would be expelled from the synagogue. ²³ For this reason his parents said, "He is of age; question him."

²⁴So a second time they called the man who had been blind and said to him, "Give God the praise! We know that this man is a sinner." ²⁵ He replied, "If he is a sinner, I do not know. One thing I do know is that I was blind and now I see." ²⁶ So they said to him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" ²⁷ He answered them, "I told you already and you did not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples, too?" ²⁸ They ridiculed him and said, "You are that man's disciple; we are disciples of Moses! ²⁹ We know that God spoke to Moses, but we do not know where this one is from." 30 The man answered and said to them, "This is what is so amazing, that you do not know where he is from, yet he opened my eyes. 31 We know that God does not listen to sinners, but if one is devout and does his will, he listens to him. 32 It is unheard of that anyone ever opened the eyes of a person born blind. 33 If this man were not from God, he would not be able to do anything." 34 They answered and said to him, "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" Then they threw him out.

³⁵ When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, he found him and said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" ³⁶ He answered and said, "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" ³⁷ Jesus said to him, "You have seen him and the one speaking with you is he." ³⁸ He said, "I do believe, Lord," and he worshiped him. ³⁹Then Jesus said, "I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind."

⁴⁰ Some of the Pharisees who were with him heard this and said to him, "Surely we are not also blind, are we?" ⁴¹ Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you are saying, 'We see,' so your sin remains.

A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. 12 A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them. ¹³ This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep. ¹⁴I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, 15 just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. 16 I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd. 17 This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again. This command I have received from my Father."

¹⁹ Again there was a division among the Jews because of these words. ²⁰ Many of them said, "He is possessed and out of his mind; why listen to him?" ²¹ Others said, "These

are not the words of one possessed; surely a demon cannot open the eyes of the blind, can he?"

Isaiah 43:1

¹ But now, thus says the LORD, who created you, Jacob, and formed you, Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name: you are mine.

You, a man, are making yourself God." 34 Jesus answered them, "Is it not written in your law, 'I said, "You are gods"'? 35 If it calls them gods to whom the word of God came, and scripture cannot be set aside, ³⁶ can you say that the one whom the Father has consecrated and sent into the world blasphemes because I said, 'I am the Son of God'? 37 If I do not perform my Father's works, do not believe me; 38 but if I perform them, even if you do not believe me, believe the works, so that you may realize [and understand] that the Father is in me and I am in the Father." 39 [Then] they tried again to arrest him; but he escaped from their power.

⁴⁰ He went back across the Jordan to the place where John first baptized, and there he remained. ⁴¹ Many came to him and said, "John performed no sign, but everything John said about this man was true." ⁴² And many there began to believe in him.

⁶I declare: "Gods though you be, offspring of the Most High all of you,

John1:19-34

¹⁹ And this is the testimony of John. When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites [to him] to ask him, "Who are you?" 20 he admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Messiah." 21 So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." 22 So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" ²³ He said: "I am 'the voice of one crying out in the desert, "Make straight the way of the Lord," as Isaiah the prophet said." ²⁴ Some Pharisees were also sent. 25 They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Messiah or Elijah or the Prophet?" ²⁶ John answered them, "I baptize with water, but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, ²⁷ the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." ²⁸ This happened in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

²⁹ The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. ³⁰ He is the one of whom I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.' ³¹ I did not know him, but the reason why I came baptizing with water was that he might be made known to Israel." ³² John testified further, saying, "I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from the sky and remain upon him. ³³ I did not know him, but the one who

sent me to baptize with water told me, 'On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the holy Spirit.' ³⁴ Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God."

John 2:13-22

¹³Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ¹⁴ He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the moneychangers seated there. ¹⁵ He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the moneychangers and overturned their tables, ¹⁶ and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." ¹⁷His disciples recalled the words of scripture, "Zeal for your house will consume me." ¹⁸ At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" ¹⁹ Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." ²⁰ The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for fortysix years, [p] and you will raise it up in three days?" 21 But he was speaking about the temple of his body. 22 Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

Verse Study: John 10:4

"When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice."

Lesson 12: Jesus, The Resurrection and the Life

John 11:1-16

¹ Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. ² Mary was the one who had anointed the Lord with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair; it was her brother Lazarus who was ill. ³ So the sisters sent word to him, saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." ⁴ When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." ⁵ Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. ⁶ So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. ⁷ Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." ⁸ The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone you,

and you want to go back there?" ⁹ Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in a day? If one walks during the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. ¹⁰ But if one walks at night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him." ¹¹ He said this, and then told them, "Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I am going to awaken him." ¹² So the disciples said to him, "Master, if he is asleep, he will be saved." ¹³ But Jesus was talking about his death, while they thought that he meant ordinary sleep. ¹⁴ So then Jesus said to them clearly, "Lazarus has died. ¹⁵ And I am glad for you that I was not there, that you may believe. Let us go to him." ¹⁶ So Thomas, called Didymus, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go to die with him."

John 11:17-27

¹⁷ When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. ¹⁸ Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two miles away. 19 And many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother. 20 When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. ²¹ Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. ²² [But] even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." ²³ Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." ²⁴ Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." ²⁵ Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, ²⁶ and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" ²⁷ She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."

Luke 10:38-42

³⁸ As they continued their journey he entered a village where a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him. ³⁹ She had a sister named Mary [who] sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. ⁴⁰ Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." ⁴¹ The Lord said to her in reply, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. ⁴² There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

²⁸ We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.

John 11:28-37

²⁸ When she had said this, she went and called her sister Mary secretly, saying, "The teacher is here and is asking for you." ²⁹ As soon as she heard this, she rose quickly and went to him. ³⁰ For Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still where Martha had met him. ³¹ So when the Jews who were with her in the house comforting her saw Mary get up quickly and go out, they followed her, presuming that she was going to the tomb to weep there. ³² When Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." ³³ When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who

had come with her weeping, he became perturbed and deeply troubled, ³⁴ and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." ³⁵ And Jesus wept. ³⁶ So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." ³⁷ But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"

Isaiah 53:3

³ He was spurned and avoided by men, a man of suffering, knowing pain, Like one from whom you turn your face, spurned, and we held him in no esteem.

Isaiah 63:8-9

⁸ He said: "They are indeed my people, children who are not disloyal." So he became their savior ⁹ in their every affliction. It was not an envoy or a messenger, but his presence that saved them. Because of his love and pity the LORD redeemed them, Lifting them up and carrying them all the days of old.

And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. ⁴² I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." ⁴³ And when he had said this, he cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" ⁴⁴ The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go."

⁵⁴ So Jesus no longer walked about in public among the Jews, but he left for the region near the desert, to a town called Ephraim, and there he remained with his disciples.

⁵⁵ Now the Passover of the Jews was near, and many went up from the country to Jerusalem before Passover to purify themselves. ⁵⁶ They looked for Jesus and said to one another as they were in the temple area, "What do you think? That he will not come to the feast?" ⁵⁷ For the chief priests and the Pharisees had given orders that if anyone knew where he was, he should inform them, so that they might arrest him.

Lesson 13: Jesus, The King

John 12:1-11

¹ Six days before Passover Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. ² They gave a dinner for him there, and Martha served, while Lazarus was one of those reclining at table with him. ³ Mary took a liter of costly perfumed oil made from genuine aromatic nard and anointed the feet of Jesus and dried them with her hair; the house was filled with the fragrance of the oil. ⁴ Then Judas the Iscariot, one [of] his disciples, and the one who would betray him, said, ⁵ "Why was this oil not sold for three hundred days"

wages and given to the poor?" ⁶ He said this not because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief and held the money bag and used to steal the contributions. ⁷ So Jesus said, "Leave her alone. Let her keep this for the day of my burial. ⁸ You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me."

⁹ [The] large crowd of the Jews found out that he was there and came, not only because of Jesus, but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. ¹⁰ And the chief priests plotted to kill Lazarus too, ¹¹ because many of the Jews were turning away and believing in Jesus because of him.

Galatians 1:10

¹⁰ Am I now currying favor with human beings or God? Or am I seeking to please people? If I were still trying to please people, I would not be a slave of Christ.

continued to testify. ¹⁸ This was [also] why the crowd went to meet him, because they heard that he had done this sign. ¹⁹ So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the whole world has gone after him."

Whoever walks in the dark does not know where he is going. ³⁶ While you have the light, believe in the light, so that you may become children of the light." After he had said this, Jesus left and hid from them.

⁴⁴ Jesus cried out and said, "Whoever believes in me believes not only in me but also in the one who sent

me, ⁴⁵ and whoever sees me sees the one who sent me. ⁴⁶ I came into the world as light, so that everyone who believes in me might not remain in darkness. ⁴⁷ And if anyone hears my words and does not observe them, I do not condemn him, for I did not come to condemn the world but to save the world. ⁴⁸ Whoever rejects me and does not accept my words has something to judge him: the word that I spoke, it will condemn him on the last day, ⁴⁹ because I did not speak on my own, but the Father who sent me commanded me what to say and speak. ⁵⁰ And I know that his commandment is eternal life. So what I say, I say as the Father told me."

Lesson 15: Jesus, The Servant

John 13:1-4

¹ Before the feast of Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to pass from this world to the Father. He loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end. ² The devil had already induced Judas, son of Simon the Iscariot, to hand him over. So, during supper, ³ fully aware that the Father had put everything into his power and that he had come from God and was returning to God, ⁴he rose from supper and took off his outer garments. He took a towel and tied it around his waist.

³ from afar the LORD appears: With age-old love I have loved you; so I have kept my mercy toward you.

Lesson 16: Jesus, The True Vine

But you know it, because it remains with you, and will be in you. ¹⁸I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. ¹⁹ In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live. ²⁰ On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you. ²¹ Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me. And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him." ²² Judas, not the Iscariot, said to him, "Master, [then] what happened that you will reveal vourself to us and not to the world?" ²³ Jesus answered and said to him, "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him. ²⁴ Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me.

²⁵ "I have told you this while I am with you. ²⁶ The Advocate, the holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name—he will teach you everything and remind you of all that [I] told you. ²⁷ Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. ²⁸You heard me tell you, 'I am going away and I will come back to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father; for the Father is greater than I. ²⁹ And now I have told you this before it happens, so that when it happens you may believe. ³⁰ I will no longer speak much with you, for the ruler of the world is coming. He has no power over me, ³¹ but the world must know that I love the Father and that I do just as the Father has commanded me. Get up, let us go.

1 John 2:5-6

⁵ But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him. This is the way we may know that we are in union with him: ⁶ whoever claims to abide in him ought to live [just] as he lived.

Lesson 17: Jesus, The Intercessor

John 16:1-11

¹"I have told you this so that you may not fall away. ²They will expel you from the synagogues; in fact, the hour is coming when everyone who kills you will think he is offering worship to God. ³They will do this because they have not known either the Father or me. ⁴I have told you this so that when their hour comes you may remember that I told you.

"I did not tell you this from the beginning, because I was with you. ⁵ But now I am going to the one who sent me, and not one of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' ⁶ But because I told you this, grief has filled your hearts. ⁷ But I tell you the truth, it is better for you that I go. For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. ⁸ And when he comes he will convict the world in regard to sin and righteousness and condemnation: ⁹ sin, because they do not believe in me; ¹⁰ righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will no longer see me; ¹¹ condemnation, because the ruler of this world has been condemned.

John 16:8-11 (RSV) "And when He comes He will convince the world of sin and of righteousness and of judgment: of sin, because they do not believe in me; of righteousness, because I go to the Father, and you will

see me no more; of judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged."

John 16:8-11 (NAB) "And when He comes He will convict the world in regard to sin and righteousness and condemnation: sin, because they do not believe in me; righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will no longer see me; condemnation, because the ruler of this world has been condemned."

John 16:12-24

¹² "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. ¹³ But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. We do

not know what he means." 19 Jesus knew that they wanted to ask him, so he said to them, "Are you discussing with one another what I said, 'A little while and you will not see me, and again a little while and you will see me'? ²⁰ Amen, amen, I say to you, you will weep and mourn, while the world rejoices; you will grieve, but your grief will become joy. ²¹ When a woman is in labor, she is in anguish because her hour has arrived; but when she has given birth to a child, she no longer remembers the pain because of her joy that a child has been born into the world. 22 So you also are now in anguish. But I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy away from you. ²³ On that day you will not question me about anything. Amen, amen, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in my name he will give you. ²⁴ Until now you have not asked anything in my name; ask and you will receive, so that your joy may be complete.

John 20:19-20

¹⁹ On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are. ¹² When I was with them I protected them in your name that you gave me, and I guarded them, and none of them was lost except the son of destruction, in order that the scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³ But now I am coming to you. I speak this in the world so that they may share my joy completely. ¹⁴I gave them your word, and the world hated them, because they do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. ¹⁵ I do not ask that you take them out of the world but that you keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. ¹⁷ Consecrate them in the truth. Your word is truth. ¹⁸ As you sent me into the world, so I sent them

into the world. ¹⁹ And I consecrate myself for them, so that they also may be consecrated in truth.

John 17:20-26

Lesson 19, Jesus, Our Truth

John 18:1-11

¹ When he had said this, Jesus went out with his disciples across the Kidron valley to where there was a garden, into which he and his disciples entered. ² Judas his betrayer also knew the place, because Jesus had often met there with his disciples. ³ So Judas got a band of soldiers and guards from the chief priests and the Pharisees and went there with lanterns, torches, and weapons. ⁴ Jesus, knowing everything that was going to happen to him, went out and said to them, "Whom are you looking for?" ⁵ They answered him, "Jesus the Nazorean." He said to them, "I AM." Judas his betrayer was also with them. ⁶ When he said to them, "I AM," they turned away and fell to the ground. ⁷ So he again asked them, "Whom are you looking for?" They said, "Jesus the Nazorean." 8 Jesus answered, "I told you that I AM. So if you are looking for me, let these men go." ⁹ This was to fulfill what he had said, "I have not lost any of those you gave me." 10 Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it, struck the high priest's slave, and cut off his right ear.

The slave's name was Malchus. ¹¹ Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword into its scabbard. Shall I not drink the cup that the Father gave me?"

Mark 14:32-41

³² Then they came to a place named Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I pray." ³³ He took with him Peter, James, and John, and began to be troubled and distressed. ³⁴ Then he said to them, "My soul is sorrowful even to death. Remain here and keep watch." ³⁵ He advanced a little and fell to the ground and prayed that if it were possible the hour might pass by him; ³⁶ he said, "Abba, Father, all things are possible to you. Take this cup away from me, but not what I will but what you will." ³⁷ When he returned he found them asleep. He said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not keep watch for one hour? ³⁸ Watch and pray that you may not undergo the test. The spirit is willing but the flesh is weak." ³⁹ Withdrawing again, he prayed,

saying the same thing. ⁴⁰ Then he returned once more and found them asleep, for they could not keep their eyes open and did not know what to answer him. ⁴¹ He returned a third time and said to them, "Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? It is enough. The hour has come. Behold, the Son of Man is to be handed over to sinners.

Luke 22:44

⁴⁴He was in such agony and he prayed so fervently that his sweat became like drops of blood falling on the ground.]

Luke 22:51

⁵¹ But Jesus said in reply, "Stop, no more of this!" Then he touched the servant's ear and healed him.

John 18:12-27

¹² So the band of soldiers, the tribune, and the Jewish guards seized Jesus, bound him, ¹³ and brought him to Annas first. He was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, who was high priest that year. ¹⁴ It was Caiaphas who had counseled the Jews that it was better that one man should die rather than the people.

¹⁵ Simon Peter and another disciple followed Jesus. Now the other disciple was known to the high priest, and he entered the courtyard of the high priest with Jesus. ¹⁶ But Peter stood at the gate outside. So the other disciple, the acquaintance of the high priest, went out and spoke to the gatekeeper and brought Peter in. ¹⁷ Then the maid who was the gatekeeper said to Peter, "You are not one of this man's disciples, are you?" He said, "I am not." ¹⁸ Now the slaves and the guards were standing around a charcoal fire that they had made, because it was cold, and were warming themselves. Peter was also standing there keeping warm.

¹⁹ The high priest questioned Jesus about his disciples and about his doctrine. ²⁰ Jesus answered him, "I have spoken publicly to the world. I have always taught in a synagogue or in the temple area where all the Jews gather, and in secret I have said nothing. ²¹ Why ask me? Ask those who heard me what I said to them. They know what I said." ²² When he had said this, one of the temple guards standing there struck Jesus and said, "Is this the way you answer the high priest?" ²³ Jesus answered him, "If I have spoken wrongly, testify to the wrong; but if I have spoken rightly, why do you strike me?" ²⁴ Then Annas sent him bound to Caiaphas the high priest.

²⁵ Now Simon Peter was standing there keeping warm. And they said to him, "You are not one of his disciples, are you?" He denied it and said, "I am not." ²⁶ One of the slaves of the high priest, a relative of the one whose ear Peter had cut off, said, "Didn't I see you in the garden with him?" ²⁷ Again Peter denied it. And immediately the cock crowed.

John 8:59

⁵⁹ So they picked up stones to throw at him; but Jesus hid and went out of the temple area

John 10:17-18

¹⁷ This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again. This command I have received from my Father."

⁵³ Do you think that I cannot call upon my Father and he will not provide me at this moment with more than twelve legions of angels?

Matthew 26:57-68

⁵⁷ Those who had arrested Jesus led him away to Caiaphas the high priest, where the scribes and the elders were assembled. 58 Peter was following him at a distance as far as the high priest's courtyard, and going inside he sat down with the servants to see the outcome. 59 The chief priests and the entire Sanhedrin kept trying to obtain false testimony against Jesus in order to put him to death, 60 but they found none, though many false witnesses came forward. Finally two came forward ⁶¹ who stated, "This man said, 'I can destroy the temple of God and within three days rebuild it." 62 The high priest rose and addressed him, "Have you no answer? What are these men testifying against you?" 63 But Jesus was silent. Then the high priest said to him, "I order you to tell us under oath before the living God whether you are the Messiah, the Son of God." 64 Jesus said to him in reply, "You have said so. But I tell you:

From now on you will see 'the Son of Man seated at the right hand of the Power' and 'coming on the clouds of heaven.'"

⁶⁵ Then the high priest tore his robes and said, "He has blasphemed! What further need have we of witnesses? You have now heard the blasphemy; ⁶⁶ what is your opinion?" They said in reply, "He deserves to die!" ⁶⁷ Then they spat in his face and struck him, while

some slapped him, ⁶⁸ saying, "Prophesy for us, Messiah: who is it that struck you?"

Luke 22:59-62

⁵⁹ About an hour later, still another insisted, "Assuredly, this man too was with him, for he also is a Galilean." ⁶⁰ But Peter said, "My friend, I do not know what you are talking about." Just as he was saying this, the cock crowed, ⁶¹ and the Lord turned and looked at Peter; and Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said to him, "Before the cock crows today, you will deny me three times." ⁶² He went out and began to weep bitterly.

John 18:28-32

²⁸Then they brought Jesus from Caiaphas to the praetorium. It was morning. And they themselves did not enter the praetorium, in order not to be defiled so that they could eat the Passover. ²⁹So Pilate came out to them and said, "What charge do you bring [against] this man?" ³⁰They answered and said to him, "If he were not a criminal, we would not have handed him over to you." ³¹At this, Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves, and judge him according to your law." The Jews answered him, "We do not have the right to execute anyone," ³²in order that the word of Jesus might be fulfilled that he said indicating the kind of death he would die.

²⁵ "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, you hypocrites. You cleanse the outside of cup and dish, but inside they are full of plunder and self-indulgence. ²⁶ Blind Pharisee, cleanse first the inside of the cup, so that the outside also may be clean.

²⁷ "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, you hypocrites. You are like whitewashed tombs, which appear beautiful on the outside, but inside are full of dead men's bones and every kind of filth. ²⁸ Even so, on the outside you appear righteous, but inside you are filled with hypocrisy and evildoing.

John 3:14

¹⁴ And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up,

John 18:33-38

summoned Jesus and said to him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" ³⁴ Jesus answered, "Do you say this on your own or have others told you about me?" ³⁵ Pilate answered, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests handed you over to me. What have you done?" ³⁶ Jesus answered, "My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants [would] be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not here." ³⁷ So Pilate said to him, "Then you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." ³⁸ Pilate said to him, "What is truth?"

Matthew 2:1-4

¹ When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, ² saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." ³ When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. ⁴ Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born.

John 19:1-3

¹Then Pilate took Jesus and had him scourged. ²And the soldiers wove a crown out of thorns and placed it on his head, and clothed him in a purple cloak, ³ and they came to him and said, "Hail, King of the Jews!" And they struck him repeatedly.

Matthew 27:27-31

²⁷ Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus inside the praetorium and gathered the whole cohort around him. ²⁸ They stripped off his clothes and threw a scarlet military cloak about him. ²⁹ Weaving a crown out of thorns, they placed it on his head, and a reed in his right hand. And kneeling before him, they mocked him,

saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" ³⁰ They spat upon him and took the reed and kept striking him on the head. ³¹ And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the cloak, dressed him in his own clothes, and led him off to crucify him.

1 Peter 2:24

²⁴He himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed.

John 19:4-11

⁴Once more Pilate went out and said to them, "Look, I am bringing him out to you, so that you may know that I find no guilt in him." 5 So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple cloak. And he said to them, "Behold, the man!" 6 When the chief priests and the guards saw him they cried out, "Crucify him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him. I find no guilt in him." ⁷The Jews answered, "We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die, because he made himself the Son of God." 8 Now when Pilate heard this statement, he became even more afraid, ⁹ and went back into the praetorium and said to Jesus, "Where are you from?" Jesus did not answer him. ¹⁰ So Pilate said to him, "Do you not speak to me? Do you not know that I have power to release you and I have power to crucify you?" 11 Jesus answered [him], "You would have no power over me if it had not been given to you from above. For this reason the one who handed me over to you has the greater sin."

Leviticus 24:16

¹⁶ whoever utters the name of the LORD in a curse shall be put to death. The whole community shall stone that person; alien and native-born alike must be put to death for uttering the LORD's name in a curse.

Matthew 27:17-19

¹⁷ So when they had assembled, Pilate said to them, "Which one do you want me to release to you, [Jesus] Barabbas, or Jesus called Messiah?" ¹⁸ For he knew that it was out of envy that they had handed him over. ¹⁹ While he was still seated on the bench, his wife sent him a message, "Have nothing to do with that righteous man. I suffered much in a dream today because of him."

John 19:12-16

¹² Consequently, Pilate tried to release him; but the Jews cried out, "If you release him, you are not a Friend of Caesar. Everyone who makes himself a king opposes Caesar."

¹³ When Pilate heard these words he brought Jesus out and seated him on the judge's bench in the place called Stone Pavement, in Hebrew, Gabbatha. ¹⁴ It was preparation day for Passover, and it was about noon. And he said to the Jews, "Behold, your king!" ¹⁵ They cried out, "Take him away, take him away! Crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your king?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar." ¹⁶ Then he handed him over to them to be crucified.

So they took Jesus,

John 19:17-27

¹⁷ and carrying the cross himself he went out to what is called the Place of the Skull, in Hebrew,
Golgotha. ¹⁸ There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, with Jesus in the middle. ¹⁹ Pilate also had an inscription written and put on the cross. It read, "Jesus the Nazorean, the King of the Jews." ²⁰ Now many of the Jews read this inscription, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, Latin, and Greek. ²¹ So the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, "Do not write 'The King of the Jews,' but that he said, 'I am the King of the Jews.'" ²² Pilate answered, "What I have written, I have written."

²³ When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his clothes and divided them into four shares, a share for each soldier. They also took his tunic, but the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece from the top down. ²⁴ So they said to one another, "Let's not tear it, but cast lots for it to see whose it will be," in order that the passage of scripture might be fulfilled [that says]:

"They divided my garments among them, and for my vesture they cast lots."

This is what the soldiers did. ²⁵ Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. ²⁶ When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son." ²⁷ Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home.

2 Corinthians 5:21

²¹ For our sake he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him.

Luke 23:34

³⁴[Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."] They divided his garments by casting lots.

John 19:28-42

²⁸ After this, aware that everything was now finished, in order that the scripture might be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I thirst." ²⁹ There was a vessel filled with common wine. So they put a sponge soaked in wine on a sprig of hyssop and put it up to his mouth. ³⁰ When Jesus had taken the wine, he said, "It is finished." And bowing his head, he handed over the spirit.

³¹ Now since it was preparation day, in order that the bodies might not remain on the cross on the sabbath, for the sabbath day of that week was a solemn one, the Jews asked Pilate that their legs be broken and they be taken down. ³² So the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first and then of the other one who was crucified with Jesus. ³³ But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs, ³⁴ but one soldier thrust his lance into his side, and immediately blood and water flowed out. ³⁵ An eyewitness has testified, and his testimony is true; he knows that he is speaking the truth, so that you also may [come to] believe. ³⁶ For this happened so that the scripture passage might be fulfilled: "Not a bone of it will be broken."

³⁷ And again another passage says: "They will look upon him whom they have pierced."

³⁸ After this, Joseph of Arimathea, secretly a disciple of Jesus for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate if he could remove

the body of Jesus. And Pilate permitted it. So he came and took his body. ³⁹ Nicodemus, the one who had first come to him at night, also came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes weighing about one hundred pounds. ⁴⁰ They took the body of Jesus and bound it with burial cloths along with the spices, according to the Jewish burial custom. ⁴¹ Now in the place where he had been crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb, in which no one had yet been buried. ⁴² So they laid Jesus there because of the Jewish preparation day; for the tomb was close by.

³ Or are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

She has done a good thing for me. ¹¹ The poor you will always have with you; but you will not always have me. ¹² In pouring this perfumed oil upon my body, she did it to prepare me for burial.

Lesson 21: Jesus, Our Restorer

John 20:1-18

¹On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. ² So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord

from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." ³ So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. ⁴ They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; ⁵ he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. ⁶ When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, ⁷ and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. ⁸ Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. ⁹ For they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead. ¹⁰ Then the disciples returned home.

¹¹ But Mary stayed outside the tomb weeping. And as she wept, she bent over into the tomb ¹² and saw two angels in white sitting there, one at the head and one at the feet where the body of Jesus had been. ¹³ And they said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken my Lord, and I don't know where they laid him." ¹⁴ When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus there, but did not know it was Jesus. 15 Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" She thought it was the gardener and said to him, "Sir, if you carried him away, tell me where you laid him, and I will take him." 16 Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni," which means Teacher. ¹⁷ Jesus said to her, "Stop holding on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and tell them, 'I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." 18 Mary of Magdala went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord," and what he told her.

Matthew 16:16-19

¹⁶ Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." ¹⁷ Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. ¹⁸ And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. ¹⁹ I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

John 20:19-31

¹⁹ On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹ [Jesus] said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." ²² And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the holy Spirit. ²³ Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

²⁴ Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." ²⁶ Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." ²⁸ Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" 29 Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

³⁰ Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of [his] disciples that are not written in this book. ³¹ But these are written that you may [come to] believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

Luke 24:36-42

³⁶ While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." ³⁷ But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸ Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? ³⁹ Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." ⁴⁰ And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹ While they were still incredulous for joy and were

amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of baked fish; ⁴³ he took it and ate it in front of them.

John 21:1-14

¹ After this, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. ² Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. ³ Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. 4When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. ⁵ Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." ⁶ So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. ⁷So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. ⁸ The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. 9 When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. 10 Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." 11 So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. 12 Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." ²⁴ It is this disciple who testifies to these things and has written them, and we know that his testimony is true. ²⁵ There are also many other things that Jesus did, but if these were to be described individually, I do not think the whole world would contain the books that would be written.

Verse Study: John 21:22

Jesus said to him, "What if I want him to remain until I come? What concern is it of yours? You follow me."
